REGULAR MEETING MINUTES -- Monday, April 8,2024

Dinner orders were taken at 6 p.m. President, Robyn Whitaker welcomed us to our meeting on this "Total Solar Eclipse" day. An amazing spectacle to witness. Cindy Pike introduced the evening speaker, Pastor Jonathan Newman.

Quorum of regular members is present.

This evening's speaker, Pastor Jonathan Newman, began by telling a little bit about his family history. He grew up in western Tennessee in poverty. His grandparents were share croppers, his mother was born and lived in a tent. By working hard and knowing and fearing God the family worked their way out of that situation. Jonathan has one brother, his mother became a school teacher and his father worked in a factory. Twenty five years ago Jonathan and his wife Jeni moved to Troy, Ohio to start a church. They now have three children. This is the first time Jonathan has run for public office. The number one reason he is running for office is when Issue #1 happened. He felt a real need to defend unborn babies. He noted "it is good to work with Democrats but there are a lot of Republicans that don't believe like him, Jim Jordan and Warren Davidson". He was in a group of ten pastors that went to Washington, D.C. with a bill to defend pastors so they can't be sued for solemnizing same sex marriage. He wants to work on addressing the needs of society, keeping transgender teaching out of schools, keeping boys out of girls restrooms, he feels Federal Government has too much power and the border issue needs to be addressed. He is a social and fiscal conservative. "We need to get behind Republican candidates to win and take back our country."
